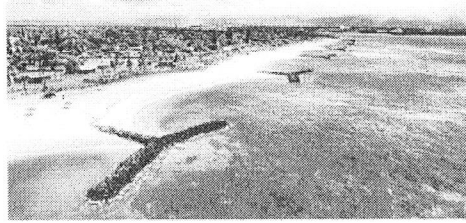
# Time to stop repeating and start solving?
