Enhanced Speed Enforcement Program Review of First Two Weeks

On June 13th the District placed a POST certified peace officer on duty to enforce the District's 15 MPH speed limit. This new officer, Matt Sokol, is a veteran Orange County Sheriff Deputy currently working in a reserve status with the County. This reserve status enables Officer Sokol to work part time in other areas of law enforcement and for other agencies.

Over the first three days of speed enforcement by Officer Sokol, he issued warnings to several violators, most of which were either community residents or guests with speeds ranging from 26 to 30 mph and a CR&R bin truck speeding at 34 mph. There were no stops recorded for construction or service vehicles with the exception of the CR&R rig.

Staff has received no comments from residents voicing opposition with the new program. Attached to this report is a copy of an email communication to the District from a resident stating his support for this improved level of service the District is now providing.

Speed Cushion Installation

A type of pre-manufactured speed bump was finally approved for use in Orange Count by the Fire Authority. One set was installed at 35345 Beach Road on Friday, June 20th. Results of the effect on speed will be monitored for a two-three week period of time before the District commits to purchasing and placing more of these units. The District may place as many as ten sets of these *speed cushion* units throughout the community in the near future.
