Allied Universal Security Contract Discussion

In attendance for this Board meeting item will be Steve Nsaif (pronounced Nay-sif), General Manager of Allied Universal Security Services. As was discussed at the last meeting, the Board was interested in exploring any opportunities at cost control with this service contract.

Mr. Nsaif will be present to discuss the possibility of a three-year contract that could result in savings to the District, along with other possible cost control options.

ITEM 6c

Police Officer Three Month Trial

At the request of the Board, the District is reinstating its Police Program that was originally activated in 2012 and operated with two POST Certified police officers continuously through July 2018 when the Board of Directors acted to terminate the program citing ineffective results with speed control.

The current Board has requested that the program be reactivated for a three-month trial period for the primary purpose of controlling speeding on Beach Road. To this end, the District has re-hired Officer Jim Williams on a part-time basis to be here on Saturdays and Mondays – this being his availability from his current full-time job as an armed site security officer with the Orange County Sanitation District. In addition to this effort, District Security has already begun handing out 15 MPH flyers at the community entrance to guests and service workers and new pavement striping will be done in early July to repaint **15 MPH** on the road surface in multiple locations. The suggestion to install an electronic speed read-out sign along the road just past the entrance has not been researched yet but will be looked into also in July – we do know that the cost ranges from \$3500 to \$6500.
