District Police Program/Budget Report

Should the Board choose to continue the District Police Program, here are the costs associated with running the program for the remainder of the fiscal year, through June 30, 2023. Note that part-time employees are not eligible for District benefits except mandated sick leave. Also, full time employees are not eligible for other benefits until after one year of employment, which will take our police officer until July 2023 to qualify for:

The District conducted an informal email survey of property owners to measure the support or opposition to the District police program. The results of that survey are provided on the following four pages.

Most questions by the undecided responses were about wanting to see data on the effectiveness of the program. Given that the trial period was only three months and that the police officer was on duty for only two days per week, the data is slim.

Additionally, the officer was not able to write citations since there are no citation books at this time. The cost for printing a minimum order is about \$1800 and because the officer was only working two days per week, that brief of a schedule did not justify the expense which would have amounted to 24% of the three-month trial period budget.
