Police Activity/April-May

In the week following the April Board meeting, it was learned that POST is requiring our Police Officer to attend a three-week requalification training course. Officer Williams POST certification had expired, which we were aware of, but it was so close to the three-year expiration that we were hoping for a waiver. POST gave some consideration to the waiver request but eventually ruled that Officer Williams would have to take the course again.

That training is scheduled for mid-July. In the meantime, no citations can be issued, so our officer will continue to run radar and intervene with speed violators without conducting any arrests.

Should a serious problem arise with a combative suspect, the local OC Sheriff can be called to assist. Our new Dana Point Police Chief, Capt. Todd Hylton, has assured us that his deputies will respond to calls for assistance.

POSTED SPEED LIMIT 15 MPH

Just so you are aware, according to the OC Superior Court Uniform Bail Schedule, the total bail amount for speeding on Beach Road will be as follows:

|----------------------------------|-------|---------------------|
| - 1-15 MPH over the speed limit | \$228 | (up to 30 MPH) |
| - 16-25 MPH over the speed limit | 352 | (31 to 40 MPH) |
| - 26 MPH and greater | 470 | (41 MPH or greater) |

Bail amounts are paid to the Court by the violator and the Court remits a portion of that back to the agency issuing the citation. Amounts remitted to the District will go into a fund for police operations.
