CITY FIREWORKS SHOW TUESDAY AT 9:00 PM

The holiday this year lands on a Tuesday and it is expected that most guests to Beach Road will take Monday off thus making it a full four-day weekend of celebration.

The weather is forecasted to be sunny with a high in the mid-70's but there will be a full moon which will bring higher tides in the late evening hours and very low minus tides in the early morning hours so really, not much of a low-tide walking beach during the day to speak of.

This lunar phase is expected to result in slower than normal beach activity for the entire long weekend. However, the security team will be increased on Tuesday to help run interference with guest traffic coming into Beach Road, and problems throughout the community.

The Dana Point PD and the Orange County Fire Authority, will be out as first-responders for any emergencies and our security patrol will be watching for parking problems to keep the roadway open for emergency vehicle access.

The construction work currently underway over in the County's Beach Park is scheduled to be ready for the public on Saturday, July 1st, creating a bit of a traffic issue at the RR grade crossing but our extra traffic control personnel will be on hand to assist in orderly movement of vehicles, cyclists and pedestrians (on Tuesday only).

Security will be enforcing the following District Ordinances and City Municipal Codes:

- NO FIREWORKS (City Code)
- NO WOOD BURNING FIRES WITHIN 30 FT OF HOMES (CBD Ordinance)
- ANY FIRES MUST BE IN A METAL CONTAINER NO FIRES DIRECTLY ON THE SAND (CBD Ord.)
- NO SMOKEY FIRES ANYWHERE (CBD Ordinance)
- ALL DOGS MUST BE ON A LEASH (City Code)

**loose dogs can be very dangerous during the fireworks show so please keep them controlled with a strong leash.
